
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

Cash Box was founded by Bill Gersh in 1942. George Albert took ownership from the late 1950s until his passing in 1997. In 2006, Bruce Elrod, a music professional and record producer, revived the magazine as an online publication with the revised name, Cashbox. Bruce partnered with music promoter and magazine publisher, Randall Wilds, in 2018. This partnership re-established Cashbox as a printed publication. Today, Wilds & Associates continues the publication of Cashbox with integrity and pride, preserving the legacy of its founders and former owners - the late Bill Gersh, George Albert, and Bruce Elrod.

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
















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
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Dear Readers and Subscribers,

With heavy hearts we announce the death of our dear friend and mentor, Bruce Elrod. At age 74, the music industry leader passed away peacefully at his home in South Carolina on October 12, 2023, surrounded by friends and family.

Bruce was born in 1949 and grew up in Columbia, South Carolina. He would become a record collector as a young lad, buying his first 78 RPM (revolutions per minute) of Billy Hayes singing *The Ballad Of Davy Crockett*. With the help of his parents and a vocational grant, right out of high school, he opened his first business, Elrod's Record Shop & Gas Station. The year was 1968, gas was \$.18 a gallon, Coke and Pepsi were \$.10 a bottle (and returnable for cash), 45 records were \$.39 and LPs were \$3.88. Folks would drive up for a fill-up and order 45s. Bruce would go on to USC to study meteorology but became a social worker. The record shop closed in 1972.

Elrod would take a music hobby and create a business called Your Hit Parade Golden Oldies. The business bought old records from stores and radio stations, then resold them. As inventory dwindled, he realized that 45s, 78s, and LPs were not being produced any longer. Elrod's business brainstorm was with the startup of Lost Gold Records in 1986. The company's first LP was artist Roz Bowie, an amazing black lady vocalist from Oklahoma. She did the recording for the Sons of Confederate Veterans. Her version of *Dixie* was perhaps the best version ever recorded, with both Billboard and Cashbox giving it tremendous reviews. On through the 80s, master tracks from various and major recording artists would duplicate into well over one-hundred CDs, each selling very well.

A conversation with Merle Kilgore and Hank Williams, Jr., about the old Cash Box magazine prompted Bruce to do some research. He secured a web domain name and, later, on July 4, 2006, the magazine went live as an online publication. The name was modified from two words – Cash Box – to one word, Cashbox. The cover was captured by Rebel's Creek from Burnsville, North Carolina. Bruce was quoted as saying, "I never realized nostalgia was as big as it was. Cashbox exploded on the internet!" With the purchase of Record World Magazine in 2013, Bruce stated, "I look for great things in the future, before I go to that great Cashbox in the sky."

In 2015, Tommy Smith, CEO of Canyon Creek Records, introduced Wilds & Associates CEO Randall Wilds to Bruce. Through this acquaintance, a business partnership was eventually established, and Wilds & Associates would become the publisher of Cashbox – reviving the magazine somewhat to its former glory as a bi-monthly, printed publication. The first printed edition of Cashbox published in November of 2018 by Wilds & Associates featured Country music artist, Blake Shelton. After a few printed issues, it became apparent that the publication was being highly received by music professionals and entertainment industry leaders. The magazine continues to grow beyond what anyone could have imagined.

Cashbox Magazine is now a part of the Wilds & Associates conglomerate, with Randall Wilds serving as C.O.O. of Cashbox and Tommy Smith as Marketing Consultant. "Bruce was an intelligent man and, as a music historian, he could tell you just about every song and artist that had ever been released to radio. Music was his life," stated Tommy. He continues, "Bruce and


Randall worked together well for many years. Every time I would talk to Bruce, he would comment on what Associates will be striving to excellently and a great job Randall had done. Cashbox is in good hands with Randall, and I believe it will be the major charting magazine that all music genres will be paying close attention to for years and years to come. Thank you, Bruce, for loving Christ enough to include our artists in your charts. Bruce would always make reference that he was a Christian Jew and was proud of it. 
Upon relocating to Nanaimo (city in British Columbia, Canada), Vince joined Big Record's Yesterdays Fate in a




supporting role and has added 80s hits playing The Walkmen and Doors tribute Mojo Risin' to his list of projects.

Born in Spartanburg, South Carolina - which was steeped in music and birthed the careers of musicians such as The Marshall Tucker Band and Pinky Anderson - she performed with many church, school, and community groups throughout her youth. After playing her first original song at the age of thirteen, Amanda knew that she had found her calling.

Amanda shares her musical influences. "Growing up in Spartanburg, I naturally loved Southern Rock! I was always drawn to the rebels of Country music, such as Hank Williams Jr, Charlie Daniels, Tanya Tucker, Travis Tritt, The Judds, etc. Throughout my journey, my music has been greatly influenced by Rock legends such as Janis Joplin, Lynyrd Skynyrd, as well as soul singers Etta James and Aretha Franklin, to name a few."

Upon graduating from the University of Florida, Cornett relocated to Nashville, Tennessee. "Once I moved to Nashville, I began honing my craft as a writer and as a vocalist," she states. "I also was put together with a few siblings who became my band family. The Almost Angels features the sibling trio Sherry Peterson-Tenille, Shawn Peterson, and Randall Scott Peterson. Performing led to finding my sound, which I call Southern Rock n Soul! It's a mixture of Country, Rock and Blues."

Amanda and The Almost Angels have been privileged to share the stage and play with great musicians. "My band and I have been fortunate enough to play with Artimus Pyle from Lynyrd Skynyrd who filled in at drums for a weekend, while a former Marshall Tucker band bassist Tim Lawter filled in another weekend! Those were both pretty epic!"

The Southern rocker also has acted in various films, music videos, and commercials. Featured in the 2009 movie, "Junkyard Dog," in addition to working with Kirsti Manna's Songwriter Girl Camp, Cornett has also written with many hit writers, including Mark Narmore, Spooner Oldham, Rich Fagan, Will Rambeaux, Greg Lawson (pop), and Kirsti Manna.

Through all the career achievements and highlights, Amanda and the band have dealt with their share of challenges business. "The the music entertainment world is unlike any other business. There is no formula for success. So, every artist's journey can be completely unique! Being in Nashville has allowed me to really take my natural talents and develop them to a

professional level. However, there are a lot of people who can say the same! One of the biggest challenges is learning to listen to advice, consider it, and decide when it is right for you! It's easy to get pulled in a million directions, so the ability to decide which advice is best takes time and honest self- consideration. I believe following has helped my career in forcing me to dig deep and not settle to be good, but to always strive for more."

Cornett's previous singles and videos have received great response by fans. "My first official music video, Swamp Love (Gator Style), written with Guy Gilchrist, definitely played to a niche crowd of Florida Gators alumni, students, and fans. The idea was a little outside the box, but I definitely feel it's been successful! The Carolina Coast single and video have really continued to do well, too. My co writers on that beachy song are Tracey Colling and Kevin Robey. We're all proud of that one!"

Amanda's current single, Soldier's Girl was co-written with artist Robert Burgeis. She shares what this very special song means to her. "I have so many friends and family



"Prior to moving to Nashville full time, I was struggling with the fight between my left and right brain...the sensible side versus my dreams," Amanda admits. "A dear friend reminded me that 'being scared is an inclination to God of disbelief. It's saying you don't trust Him to take care of you.' That still resonates with each step of my career. I pray about my decisions and direction and try to follow where I'm being pushed."

"My mission is to create and execute musical experiences people can deeply feel. If you hear me play solo or with my band, I pray you will feel something real. My band and I have so much fun on stage and hope our audiences have at least half as much fun as we do. We truly love playing music together! We are always happy to meet people and engage after shows, as well. It's not about us, but about how the music hits you...all of you."

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CASHBOX Artist Spotlight TOM HEYMAN

Singer/songwriter and multi-instrumentalist Tom Heyman started playing and recording in the late 1980s with the Philadelphia-based band, Go To Blazes. He wrote songs, played guitar, and the band released five full-length records and toured the US and Europe extensively before breaking up in 1997.

After relocating to San Francisco in 1998, he began working as a sideman, eventually joining local favorites The Court and Spark, as well as Chuck Prophet's band in addition to work touring and recording with John Doe,

Alejandro Escovedo, Sonny Smith, Hiss Golden Messenger, and many other artists. All the while he was discovering his voice as a solo artist and bandleader.

Heyman considers such legends as Pink Floyd, REO Speedwagon, Allman Brothers, and Styx as his influences in music.

His second solo record "Deliver Me," was critically acclaimed, receiving 4-star reviews in both Mojo and Uncut Magazine, and songs from the record were heard in the TV shows True Blood, Justified, and Damages.

Tom remembers what shaped him as an artist. "The biggest factor for being where I am today in music, was overcoming self-doubt. The second contributing factor was converting that belief into work, effort, and a tireless pursuit to add my color to the world of music by having elements in style comparable to the 70s-80s sound. It was a great era of music."

"24th Street Blues," is the musician's sixth solo recording. The concept of the album is about the endangered culture and living ghosts of San Francisco's Mission District where he resides. The CD has a companion 60-page songbook comprising lyrics and music charts accompanied by a gorgeous collection of paintings and drawings that were designed as companion pieces for each song. These were created by Heyman's wife Deirdre F. White, an artist and educator acutely tuned into composing images of modern dystopian inequality and the housing/mobility challenges of the American West.

The intention was to create a sound that combined the loose, late-night, low-down groove of JJ Cale with the bittersweet melancholia of late period Nick Lowe and the melodic storytelling of Heyman's hero, Gordon Lightfoot. The record was written mostly at night, after long bar shifts



and is an examination of the loneliness and alienation of a city in flux and the true cost of love. "24th Street Blues" was released on October 6, 2023, in vinyl, compact disc, and digital formats.

Heyman mentions, "My biggest highlight was landing in The American Independent Chart Top 40 at #8 with *Time For a Change* for almost a consecutive year. This song is not only a cry for humanity, "The Macro", but also "the change" from within it took to pursue music again with full intensity and fervor."

Tom Heyman has enjoyed several accolades during his career - Tune Derby 'Song of the Month', May 2023, 1st place trophy and cash for *Hamster Wheel*, 'Video of the Month' award, #1 on The Isaac Banks Radio Show for *Ride or Die*, which is his latest single. *Love Triangle* was selected by The Cannes Music Festival to be possibly used in synch placement. Heyman received ISSA Awards and Josie Awards nominations for *Time for a Change* and *Hamster Wheel*.

He mentions what fans can expect from his shows. "Great energy, heartfelt performances, and clean full band sound. Fans would leave having had an experience to be remembered."

Heyman shares his thoughts during a hiatus from music. "A three-year period prior to me returning to music where introspection, seeking truth, and going within, helped me to become a much better version of myself."

"I want to be able to help other artists to be able to reach their goals with shared knowledge of how the music business works. To be able to make an impact on and possibly inspire others to want to learn music, like Pink Floyd did for myself."



Amy's first album, "Building Reasons And Dreams," was dedicated in honor and memory of her brother Brad, featuring songs from the heart that are healing for the soul. Her music is inspiring and has brought healing to people all over the world who are in recovery, struggling with mental health issues, coping with the loss of loved ones, or in need of inspiration to live life to the fullest.

She recalls some memorable moments that will always stand out in her mind. "I cherish every one of my music career memories, both big and small. Some highlights are performing my hit song, My Angel, in honor of my angel brother Brad, for the Josie Music Awards Ceremony. I will never forget feeling like my childhood dream of "one day being like Dolly" had come full circle on that iconic Celebrity Theater stage inside Dollywood Theme Park and Resort, in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee. And performing Ralph Stanley's version of *This Little Light Of Mine* on the Grand Ole Opry Stage. I had the time of my life paying tribute to the legendary Dr. Ralph Stanley. This was one of the most spiritual experiences of my career, a night on which I felt the presence of many angels in the wings."

I am honored to be the Founder, Executive Producer and initiator of Spread Hope Send Love Around The World - The Power Of One Movement to bring awareness for suicide prevention. I am over the moon to be living proof that a dream I thought took four years to make happen is actually a thirty-seven-year dream in the making that was destined to come to fruition at this very time. Since I was thirteen, I dreamed of being a part of a project like Michael Jackson's and Lionel Richie's We Are The World."

At the age of 50, she is living her biggest childhood dream of being "all the things" - a wife, mom, Brownie, (aka Grandma), a multi award winning singer, songwriter and performer, a self-help influencer, and energy healer. Given her dedication to "paying it forward," Amy always says "yes" to her music supporting a cause, no matter how large or small the platform. She reaches out whenever and wherever possible, making a difference worldwide, by supporting many philanthropic causes and charities.

"My goals are to continue following my heart on this most beautiful path of alignment I am on. Although I'd love to be able to tell you what lies ahead, I will quote the lyrics from one of my most favorite songs I've ever penned and recorded instead. It is titled God Dreams For Me... 'I could never imagine what was coming my way, because bigger than any dream I could ever dream, is the one God dreams for me.'"

Amy concludes, "It is very near and dear to my heart, as my daughter Maycee stars as the younger version of myself, and my son-in- law Jackson Bithell produced, filmed, and edited the story of how my music career came to be." The song and video is available on YouTube.

Amy's biggest dream is that everyone gets to live theirs. She wants everyone to succeed, and she truly intends to continue shining her own light, while helping others shine their brightest too.

The impact of lawlessness is hard to understand as it impacts the day-to-day lives of ordinary people in Haiti. Dr. Dan's family, the operation of the medical clinic, and ministry are greatly impacted. The difficulties in getting food, fuel, power, and medical supplies all require increasing effort and time. Needless to say, the costs have skyrocketed. Furthermore, the violence has spread.

"Here in Gonaives nothing is certain because each day at 16 miles from our city several people have died or kidnapped. I don't know when but I know that God will do something. The situation is really complicated and impossible for us, but with God all things is possible." Dr. Dan continues the medical mission work. He even conducted a remote clinic on August 19.





Domestic Trailer Update:

We've done a lot of work all over the world, and now we are embarking on a domestic component. This trailer was purchased to minister in underserved areas and to underserved people – those who don't have the capacity or the money to seek dental or medical care. We're going to do

dental on one end of the trailer, and medical on the other end. I am so thankful that you joined us on this journey. And hopefully we'll be in your hometown somewhere and give all your people an opportunity to serve on this trailer and to volunteer for people who need our services, and show what the Christian churches will be able to do with this kind of ministry.



Barry reflects on when his love for music started. "I grew up in a musical family playing bass with my brothers and uncles in a Bluegrass band." He credits Paul McCartney and James Brown as his musical influences.

Barry is a NASCAR/Motorsports Chaplain and volunteers as Shop Chaplain for Motor Racing Outreach (MRO). "We have done volunteer work with Richard Childress Racing, Wood Brothers Racing, Richard Petty Motor Sports, and Morgan Shepherd Racing. We do chapel services for NASCAR and Raceway Ministries, national drag race events, and I am ordained with Racers for Christ (RFC). We also do chapel services for National Hot Rod Association (NHRA)."

Barry's current services and live musical productions are as follows: Evangelistic messages as a Motorsports Chaplain, Harvey Tater (Musical Comedy), John on the Island of Patmos (Musical Drama), David and Goliath - The Battle is the Lord's (Musical Drama), Jonah's Journey (Comedy), Daniel in the Lion's Den (Musical Drama), Noah (Musical Drama) and Johnny Rock - 81-year-old rock star (Musical Comedy). Each year Barry is scheduled at multiple revivals, youth crusades, vacation bible schools and family church services, as well as numerous prison campaigns and racing events.

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at, who is fifteen years old, chose to take a voice class over a dance class at the age of six. At fifteen months younger, Presley Rose, who is fourteen, followed in her sister's footsteps. She took to the keys in such a way that it wasn't long before it was clear that she had an ear for pitch. Harmonies quickly followed and the pair was singing live at ages seven and eight. That began the musical journey of what would eventually be The Bennett Hall Band. Kat picked up the guitar at nine years old so she could begin songwriting and accompanying herself. Four months after her first lesson, she played it on stage for a live audience. Presley Rose developed a love for all instruments and became the band's utility player at age ten, playing keys, bass, upright bass, ukulele and even some harmonica. Presley is able to take any song to the next level.

Josie Hope has been on the stage since the tender age of three years old. She began waiting in the crowd for her turn to sing, while visiting and doing remarkable PR work for the band! Josie currently plays drums while singing and playing on multiple songs. Josie Hope is ten years old and is the highlight of the live shows with her huge personality and even larger vocals!

The trio is unstoppable, playing all over middle Tennessee on stages at venues like The Station Inn, Lower Broadway, Mellow Mushroom, Dierks Bentley's Whiskey Room, The Johnny Cash Hideaway Farm, Kimbro's Pickin' Parlor, Puckett's, Hop Springs, The Franklin Main Street Festival, and The Broken Wheel Festival. With experience under their belt and the ability to accompany themselves on more than fifty cover songs and dozens of originals, The Bennett Hall Band is taking the Nashville music scene by storm.

Kat, Presley and Josie have shared the stage with several notable artists including Jamie Johnson, Lee Brice, Randy Houser, Dennis Quaid, and Cody Jinks. They shared the stage at the Station Inn with 45 RPM which includes famed musicians Jimmy Melton, Joe Spivey, and ACM steel guitar player of the year Mike Johnson. They sang the National Anthem at Oceanway Studio BMI that has aired all over the country. The girls have led Youth Worship at Grace Church Nashville. Kat won Nashville's Got Talent Youth Division at eleven and Presley got third place in Steinway Competition at age nine years old.

This talented trio says, "It can be difficult putting in the work, balancing school and music, and having time for fun and friends. We have been singing on stages since we were seven, six, and three. We believe this is a calling and God gave us a gift to help others and spread joy through our music and we want to honor Him. We have been greatly blessed with some awesome friends that we have had since we were in elementary school that are so supportive and wonderful.

Some of our best friends are guys, they don't really care what we do on stage, they just want to beat us at bowling or putt putt! We know God knew this would be a challenge. That is why He gave us each other! We are very close, and we have a lot of fun together."

The girls add, "We want to encourage young girls to embrace their own gifts and celebrate the gifts of their friends. We are all uniquely made in the image of God. No one was skipped over! We want to spread hope and joy and light and to encourage our generation to find their gifts and use them to honor God."

They released their first full album, "Say Yes" on May 1, 2023 which is available on all streaming platforms and on CD for purchase on their website. The project has offered a few singles including the title cut. Be looking for their next single to be dropped this fall, *We Love Country Music*. It's a fun, up tempo sing-along that the fans will love.

Recently, these siblings played the Ryman and BMI Block Party Stage at CMA Fest which was an awesome experience for the band. The band has a collective goal in mind: They all hope to play the Grand Ole Opry before Kat turns sixteen. At every show the band will sing at least one song that shares their faith. Kat will introduce it with "Ok ya'll, we are going to take you to church with this one." This could be any song from *Amazing Grace* to *My Jesus* (Anne Wilson). They realize that this boldness won't always be received well in every concert setting, especially at a bar or listening room. Kat shares, "Our hope is the audience is enjoying our show so much they'll be listening to whatever we sing, and it will give us the opportunity to plant a seed in the heart of someone that is lost."

The girls' mother Melanie shares some insight into her children's lives. "Bennett is our third child, due fourteen months after Presley. He is our only boy and died at birth as a result of being born too early from a ruptured placenta. He lives with Jesus, but these girls talk about him all of the time. Ironically, our youngest Josie Hope, who came along two years later, was born only four gestational weeks later than Bennett at 24 weeks. She was born early for the same reason!




She was 1lb 4oz at birth and spent 106 days in the NICU, on a ventilator for the first eight weeks! She is, by all definitions, an absolute miracle. They warned us that she may not be able to live a "normal life." Well, I guess they were right about that!! She is exceptional in every way and a huge testimony to the power of prayer and faith. She has her own Facebook page, Josie Hope Hall, you can see the history there. When we sat down as a family to name the band, my husband Shawn suggested we somehow honor Bennett in the name, and thus the girls decided not to just honor him but to name the band after him. His name lives on in their music, band merch, website etc. It is really amazing to witness. That's how they became The Bennett Hall Band!"

They want to continue to build a platform in music and use it to help others and shine the light and love of Jesus; to encourage their generation to follow their dreams, make their own path, and use their gifts to honor the kingdom of God.

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Where Are They Now?

A Retrospective Glimpse at Yesterday's Rising Music Stars
Who Became Icons and Where They Are Today

THIS EDITION: Deniece Williams

escribed as "one of the great soul voices" by the BBC, Deniece Williams first achieved success as an award-winning singer. songwriter, and producer in the 1970s and '80s. She is best known for the songs *Free*, *Silly*, *It's Gonna Take a Miracle*, and two Billboard Hot 100 No.1 singles *Let's Hear It for the Boy* and *Too Much*, *Too Little*, *Too Late* (with Johnny Mathis).

Deniece Williams was born in Gary, Indiana and grew up singing in the Church of God in Christ. Her favorite vocalists were Carmen McRae and Nancy Wilson, and she was also inspired by her parents, both of whom sang. From 1968 through 1970, while in her late teens, Williams recorded six singles for the Chicago-based Toddlin' Town label. None of the singles charted, but *I'm Walking Away* and *Mama, I Wish I Stayed at Home* became favorites of the U.K.'s northern soul scene. Williams temporarily left music behind to pursue nursing education and steady employment and started a family.

Through her cousin, Williams met Stevie Wonder - another one of her favorites - backstage at a concert. This led to an audition and her joining Wonderlove, Wonder's group of background vocalists. Williams performed and recorded

with the Motown artist for a three-year period that included the sessions for "Talking Book," "Fulfillingness' First Finale," and "Songs in the Key of Life." During this time, Williams contributed background vocals to recordings by numerous other artists ranging from Don Everly and Kenny Rankin to Esther Phillips and Roberta Flack. She also co-wrote material for the Soul Train Gang (including the Wonder-arranged, *Baby Open the Door*, featuring her on co-lead vocals) and Merry Clayton (*How'd I Know.*)

Williams pursued a solo career and signed a production deal with Maurice White and Charles Stepney and joined the roster of Columbia Records, home to White's band, Earth, Wind & Fire. Williams released her first album, "This Is Niecy," in 1976. Produced by Stepney and White, it featured the number 2 hit *Free*, which also crossed over to number 25 on the Hot 100. *Cause You Love Me Baby* and *That's What Friends Are For* also charted. Williams co-wrote all three of the singles, and among the deep cuts was *Slip Away*.

Williams' second album, recorded in the wake of Stepney's death by heart attack, yielded the Top 20 soul single *Baby, Baby My Love's All for You*. After that, she connected with fellow Columbia artist Johnny Mathis for *Too Much, Too Little, Too Late*, which was a number one hit on the Soul, and Adult Contemporary charts. Its success led to the duet partners making the album, "That's What Friends Are For."



Williams changed direction somewhat with her third solo album, her first to bear the imprint of Maurice White's Columbia-distributed ARC (short for American Recording Company). Released in 1979, "When Love Comes Calling" saw Williams work separately with David Foster and Ray Parker, Jr. as co-producers. The biggest single from the album was *I've Got the Last Dance*.

Williams had two more LPs to cut for ARC. "My Melody" and "Niecy," respectively released in 1981 and 1982, were well-received collaborations with Philly Soul originator Thom Bell. That resulted in the singer's third gold album (for the former), Top 20 soul entries with *What Two Can Do* and *Silly*, and a number one soul hit with *It's Gonna Take a Miracle*, her first Grammy-nominated recording (for 'Best R&B Vocal Performance, Female'). In '82, Williams and Mathis were heard together again on the theme for the television sitcom Family Ties, *Without Us*.

Williams moved back to Columbia records for her next R&B and Jazz giants. two albums teaming up with George Duke. In 1983 she released "I'm So Proud," highlighted by the number nine Black Singles hit *Do What You Feel*, earned Williams' second Grammy nomination for 'Best R&B Performance' and was followed by another hit duet with Mathis, an update of *Love Won't Let Me Wait*.

Deneice was approached by Paramount to record the bubbly Let's Hear It for the Boy for the soundtrack of "Footloose." The song scored a global hit that in the U.S. alone topped the Hot 100, Black Singles, and Dance charts. Next Love also charted from the album "Let's Hear It for the Boy," which was among the nominees for 'Best R&B Performance' in the female category. Let's Hear It for the Boy itself was nominated for a Grammy in the pop performance field.

Rather than take advantage of her considerable Pop momentum, Williams opted to record her first Contemporary Gospel album. The decision wasn't all that surprising given that her LPs dating back to "This Is Niecy" contained faith-based material. Whiter Than Snow was nominated for a Grammy as 'Best Inspirational Song.' "So Glad I Know" arrived on the Sparrow label in 1986 and fared well on Billboard's Gospel and Christian charts. It garnered three Grammy nominations. Williams took the award for 'Best Soul Gospel Performance, Female' (I Surrender All) and with featured guest Sandi Patty won 'Best Gospel Performance by a Duo or Group, Choir or Chorus' for They Say, the solo original version of which appeared on "I'm So Proud."

Williams continued to release secular material, too. Her Gospel recordings for Sparrow resumed in 1989 with "Special Love" and guest appearances on "Children in Praise" by the West Angeles Church of God in Christ Angelic Choir. By the end of the decade, she was nominated for four additional Grammys, winning 'Best Gospel Performance, Female' for *I Believe in You* (off "Water Under the Bridge"). During the '90s, Williams made guest appearances on albums by the likes of Nancy Wilson, George Duke, and Stevie Wonder and

released three Gospel albums on as many labels. "Lullabies to Dreamland" was issued in 1991, trailed five years later by "Love Solves It All." The third one, "This Is My Song," won the 1998 Grammy award for 'Best Pop/Contemporary Gospel Album'

Nine years passed before her next release, "Love, Niecy Style," on which she covered R&B classics spanning the '60s, '70s, and early '80s. Duke, Wonder, and Earth, Wind & Fire's Philip Bailey were among the collaborators on the album, produced by Bobby Eli, a Philly Soul vet who worked on Williams' early '80s sessions with Thom Bell.

Williams' soaring, four-octave soprano voice made her one of the most distinctive talents to arrive during the Soul era. Since her recording debut in 1968, she established herself in the 70s, first as part of Stevie Wonder's Wonderlove, then as a songwriter, and finally as a solo artist who could also produce and arrange her own material while partnering with R&B and Jazz giants.



Williams, now 73, has continued to perform and act, and has recorded the occasional single, such as the independently released 2020 track *When You Love Somebody*. This was followed by a new EP titled "Gemini," released in the fall of 2021. On June 30, 2021, she was honored as one of the first ever inductees into the Women Songwriters Hall of Fame. In the Spring of this year, Williams was also bestowed with the keys to the city of Kingston, Jamaica.

knowing scars of that truth, and the result is a sound that infuses elements of her own story into every song she sings, making it her own. She never gave a song a choice. That's just Niecie.







Christmas at the Opry will air December 7, beginning at 8 p.m. ET on NBC. The special will also be available to stream exclusively on Peacock the following day.





Usher to Headline Halftime Show for 2024 Super Bowl

The *Yeah!* singer will be performing the halftime show at Allegiant Stadium on February 11 in Las Vegas. The eight-time Grammy winner spoke about the honor on a live TV interview. "This is a moment that I've waited my entire life for, and I am not coming to disappoint," he told CBS Mornings' Gayle King, Tony Dokoupil and Nate Burleson. "This is going to be a celebration."

Usher, who joined the interview virtually from Paris, said he learned of the news "literally days before the announcement." "The hardest part is really the suspense," he said of having to keep the secret from his friends and family.

The CBS co-anchors then asked which of his multitude of hits he would try to squeeze into the 13-minute show. "I definitely have a long list of people whom I've collaborated with and also a long list of songs that mean something so much to people - for every experience that I've had, there's a song," Usher went on to add, "So I'm trying to figure out how to entertain people, make certain the legacy, enjoy the moment, and make certain they'll have a show they'll never forget."

This will mark Usher's second Super Bowl appearance, as he previously performed with the Black Eyed Peas back in 2011, but his first time as the headlining artist. "It's an honor of a lifetime to finally check a Super Bowl performance off my bucket list. I can't wait to bring the world a show unlike anything else they've seen from me before. Thank you to the fans and everyone who made this opportunity happen," he continued. "I'll see you real soon."



During his interview with CBS, Usher expanded on the honor: "Thirty years ago, I made a commitment to offer my best and here thirty years later now, it's being rewarded with one of the most prestigious performances and stages anybody could ever play on." he said.

"I'm humbled by the opportunity to do that, but I'm more happy to be able to celebrate with the people that I love the most, you know what I'm saying, and celebrate in a way that people will remember through dance, through skate, through collaboration, so it's going to be a night of celebration," Usher continued.

"Every aspect of what has influenced me to be the artist that I am, I'm gonna try to bring that out of me in that moment. And I thank God."

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








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


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Johnny Mathis Releases Much Anticipated Christmas Album in a Decade

Johnny Mathis has continued to release new holiday music throughout the past 65 years. Starting with his debut, "Merry Christmas," in 1958, Mathis went on to release several more holiday albums, including "Sounds of Christmas" (1963), "Give Me Your Love for Christmas" (1969), "Christmas Eve With Johnny Mathis" (1986), "The Christmas Album" (2002), and his Grammynominated "Sending You a Little Christmas" in 2013, featuring collaborations with Natalie Cole, Billy Joel, Gloria Estefan, Vince Gill, Amy Grant, and more.



It's been a decade and now Mathis is releasing his seventh holiday album "Christmas Time is Here," out now. Named after the Vince Guaraldi and Lee Mendelson-composed song of the same name for the 1965 animated TV special A Charlie Brown Christmas, the ten-track album features newly recorded holiday songs and expands on his 2022 Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas.

The album was produced by the singer's longtime collaborator Jay Landers (Barbra Streisand, Bette Midler, Andrea Bocelli) - who worked on 13 albums with Mathis - along with Fred Mollin (Kristin Chenoweth, Jimmy Webb, Natalie Cole, Billy Joel), who collaborated with him on "Let It Be Me: Mathis in Nashville" (2010) and "Sending You a Little Christmas," which featured collaborations with Natalie Cole, Billy Joel, Gloria Estefan, Vince Gill, Amy Grant, and more.

Recorded at the Capitol Recording Studio in Hollywood, California, and Nashville, Tennessee, "Christmas Time is Here" features Mathis' renditions of holiday classics, including *Blue Christmas*, a remake of Johnny's No. 1 U.K. single, and the title track from A Charlie Brown Christmas. Several holiday standards also fill out the album, including *Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas, When a Child is Born, Merry Christmas, Baby, O Little Town of Bethlehem* and *Santa Claus is Coming to Town* featuring Kristin Chenoweth.

A five-time Grammy nominee, West has had cuts by Rascal Flatts, Scotty McCreery, Casting Crowns (including back-to-back #1 singles), Michael W. Smith, and Amy Grant, among others, and has notched 30 #1 songs as an artist and/or songwriter. Amy Grant, Michael W. 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


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Rock & Roll Hall of Fame Member and Former Lynyrd Skynyrd Drummer Artimus Pyle Releases "Anthems: Honoring the Music of Lynyrd Skynyrd" with Special Guests

Long considered the "wild man" of Lynyrd Skynyrd, Artimus Pyle's powerful and distinctive double bass drumming helped define the legendary Skynyrd sound. Artimus got his first real break at the Charlie Daniels Volunteer Jam. His first recording lists - Artimus Pyle, percussion. Then with other work for the Marshall Tucker Band, Artimus became known as a powerful session drummer.



Using his connections with Charlie Daniels and Marshall Tucker, both acts that often toured with Skynyrd, Artimus met with Ronnie Van Zant and Ed King at Studio One in Doraville, Georgia. The results of that meeting - Saturday Night Special greatly impressed Ronnie. Artimus' live debut with the band took place in Jacksonville's Sgt Pepper's Club in October 1974. He would replace their original drummer (Bob Burns) following the release of the group's second album, "Second Helping," and performed with the band and on Skynyrd's following four albums, "Nuthin' Fancy," "Gimme Back My Bullets," "Street Survivors," and their live album, "One More for the Road."

Pyle was injured but survived the band's 1977 horrific plane crash that abruptly ended the lives of six people, including band members Steve and Cassie Gaines, and most notably, frontman and musical visionary Ronnie Van Zant.

Now, 45 years later, Artimus Pyle prepares for the release of his forthcoming Get Joe Records studio album honoring the music

that propelled him into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. The album, which boasts 13 tracks, features special guests including Sammy Hagar, Dolly Parton, Marty Raybon, and others. The album will be released and distributed by BFD/Orchard on February 2, 2024.

"This project has been a year in the making, but when the fans hear it they will understand why it took so long," says Len Snow, Get Joe Records president. "Artimus is legendary within the Southern Rock space. The music that Lynyrd Skynyrd made will always live as a part of Rock history. This album honors that music and gives Artimus a way to honor his former bandmates."

Now in his 70s, Pyle still continues to honor Van Zant's musical legacy, recording and touring with the Artimus Pyle Band, now comprised of Pyle (drums), Scott Raines (guitar/vocals), Jerry Lyda (guitar) Brad Durden (keyboards/vocals), and Dave Fowler (bass).

Country music fans are invited to immerse in the unforgettable nostalgia of 80s and 90s Country music with a wide selection of hits, performed by acclaimed singer Sammy Sadler with special guest Leon Everette. The 90-minute show is a combination of great hits and a history told by two performers who were both there and experienced different parts of it.

In 1989, Sadler was a critically acclaimed newcomer to the Country music fold and had already charted several successful singles. He was ready to release his first album on Evergreen Records when tragedy struck. While out one evening on Nashville's famed 16th Avenue, he and friend Kevin Hughes were shot by a man wearing a ski mask. While Sammy survived, Hughes, who was the Cash Box Chart manager, did not. Details on why the shooting happened would reveal a payola scandal that brought down the magazine and rocked the Country music industry. It became known around the world as the Murder on Music Row. Through the pain and

challenges, one thing never changed and that was Sadler's love for Country music. It was also his desire to get back out on the road performing for audiences.

Country legend Leon Everette has had nine Gold albums. His first record to make it to the top ten Billboard charts was "Over." This led to a recording contract with RCA in 1980, which garnered 11 straight top 10 records. One of those songs was Hurricane which peaked at #1 on the charts. He would go on to have two more #1 hits. Hurricane was so popular in Louisiana that he served as the Grand Marshall of Mardi Gras. Everette's popularity led to

his being the first Country artist ever to perform in Italy. He was nominated for 'New Male Vocalist of the Year' in 1981, had one of the biggest selling records of the year "Give Me What You Think Is Fair" in 1983, and his band (Hurricane) won 'Traveling Band of the Year' in 1983. He was also one of the first Country artists to perform at Wembley Stadium in London, England. Suffering from burnout in the mid 80s, Everette retired from the music industry and moved back to Ward, South Carolina where he became involved with several business endeavors.

In 1997, he became a born-again Christian, and devoted his time to his church. However, much to the delight of those who loved his music, he found time to start performing Country and Gospel music again. In early 2016 Leon was invited back to Nashville to record I Stand the Tallest When I'm Down On My Knees with longtime friend Little David Wilkins. The song ended up #1 for five weeks on the Christian Country Charts.

"For all of my career I have always been a planner, sometimes planning two or three years in advance, what we will do, where we will go, and when we record," expresses Duane Allen. "As we celebrate fifty years of being together, just as you see us, we will, also, begin our 'American Made: Farewell Tour.' I don't know how long the tour will last, but we hope to return to as many parts of the country as we can. Thank you so much for these fifty years. For me, it's 57 1/2 years. I have given you the best part of my life and you have rewarded me with a wonderful career. Thank you, our dear fans. Thanks to God for His divine guidance. Thank you to our wonderful organization. Thank you to all the supporting companies who represent us. And thank you to our families."



rowing up in Monroe, Louisiana with a solid, southern upbringing, Brei's family raised her on several authentic southern staples: the Bible, Lone Star Missionary Baptist Church's choir, Charley Pride, Loretta Lynn, Aretha Franklin, and no shortage of familial love and devotion.

Brei has earned her bachelor's in business, master's in international relations, and a doctorate in theology. She is also a proud Veteran of the U.S. Army, where she served as an enlisted soldier and as an officer. Having moved to Nashville soon thereafter, she has quickly established herself in the songwriter's community as a smooth and sometimes edgy songstress who merges Country, Soul and Southern Pop into one fused style.

Brei reflects on her upbringing and how it shaped her life. "I've been around music my entire life, whether it's been singing in a choir, singing in talent shows or playing a musical instrument, taking vocal lessons and listening to various genres of music. It has always been around, and I've had a love for music since I was a little girl. I think just growing up with a musical family, the church choir and playing a musical instrument - all of these things helped or played a part in where I am today. But I would honestly add that the military played a critical part, in the fact of the discipline that's a huge part of the foundation. Not being afraid and willing to put everything on the line for what you believe in."

She has been influenced by multi-genres of artists ranging from Patsy Cline, Loretta Lynn, Tina Turner, Aretha Franklin, Charley Pride, Dolly Parton, Kenny Rogers, and countless others. She says, "I loved everything from Gospel to Motown, from Country to Rock. In addition to some of the famous names, I also loved hearing my mother sing. She was actually my first influence in having a great appreciation for music. She's always been a songbird and I love to hear her sing."

Her first single on country radio, *Gave Him A Girl* was immediately recognized as "cute and catchy" by Country music journalist and historian Robert K. Oermann from Music Row Magazine.

It could be said that Brei has already had career milestones added to her bucket list. She made her CMA Fest debut in 2022, performed on the Huckabee Show and singing the National Anthem at Vanderbilt University's athletic event at Memorial Coliseum. She admits, "Honestly, every opportunity whether big or small is still memorable and equally important because I get the opportunity to make new fans! I'm looking forward to building upon these and adding many more career highlights."

In 2022, Carter released her debut album "Brand New Country," which included her fan-favorite cover of Charley Pride's *Kiss an Angel Good Mornin*, and her life's musical story *Stronger Than That*. The latest original single release from the Louisiana native is *Straight Up Country Crazy*. The

follow up single, *Sun Is Still Shinin*' will be available soon. Brei mentions, "I'm currently in the studio with music producer Jimmy Ritchie and writing with many people. Stay tuned, great things are on the horizon."

When asked what inspires and motivates her, Brei replied, "God is no respecter of persons, He's our Heavenly Father and He has an abundance of blessings for all of us. We should never let society dictate our journey in life or our walk with God and His plans for our lives. What God has for you, is for you. Enjoy the journey and let God lead you. I know that all things are possible to those that believe so never give up or give in. Know that the best is still to come if you continue to do your part. Life has many ups and downs and twists and turns but, in the end, if you stay faithful and faint not you'll realize that your dreams are coming true and manifesting themselves right in front of your very eyes"

When coming to a show, she says, "Fans can expect someone that's genuine, caring and real. Expect a good time, a good feeling, and a memory of a lifetime. My goal is to create a feeling of happiness."

Brei gets fans in the holiday spirit this season with her new seven song Christmas EP, "Twinkling Tales of Christmas," due out November 10 by Brown Lee Entertainment & The Orchard. Known for having a festive and vivacious personality year-round, Carter's new EP is a multi-faceted genre collection of original songs which draws

upon her established Country, Southern Pop, Soul and R&B musical influences. "Twinkling Tales of Christmas" takes its listeners through a range of emotions and paying homage to the warmth, joy, and shared experiences that define that special time of year. The new EP is anchored by the festive, *Santa Wontcha*, which she released as a single in Christmas of 2021, and the song's music video is out now. Carter co-wrote *Santa Woncha* with Nashville hit songwriter Corey Lee Barker.

Carter has become a welcome addition to the emerging new styles of Country music blossoming in today's diverse musical landscape. She has already accomplished many goals in her life, but there is no question she has many more goals in her sights. "I want to be a household name and make a difference in millions of lives. I want to touch people through my music and any outreach programs that God leads me to be a part of. Music bridges the gap in a lot of disparities and heals the broken. I know that I'd love to be on Billboard someday and honestly to go as high as my journey and destiny leads me. Some say that the sky's the limit, but I'd like to believe that there are no limitations to where my music can go someday."



This married duo, known simply as Cliff & Susan, have captured the hearts of audiences all around the world with their incredible musical talents and dynamic chemistry onstage.

Cliff and Susan met in 2016 on stage at Willy D's Rock & Roll Piano Bar in Little Rock, Arkansas. They immediately clicked and began performing together as Cliff joined Susan in her show at Oaklawn Casino in Hot Springs, Arkansas. Within a year, they had eloped in Las Vegas and were touring the world together. It was a whirlwind romance that was only the beginning of their incredible journey in the music industry.

Both Cliff and Susan have deep roots in Arkansas and a strong passion for music. Susan, originally from Magnet Cove, Arkansas, discovered her love for music at a young age, taking classical piano lessons and performing in various pageants and talent contests. 

Both projects have been seven years in the making and are eagerly anticipated by their fans and fellow artists alike. Along with their music, Cliff and Susan have also ventured into the business side of the industry, founding Big Red Dog Productions, a music production and artist development company, and the Yadaloo Music & Arts Festival, which won Arkansas's Best New Festival of the Year in 2019.

Their passion for supporting and uplifting other independent artists led them to create the Entertainers Academy, a platform to help aspiring musicians build profitable careers in the ever-evolving music industry. They also host the Cliff & Susan Podcast, where they share insights and experiences from their own journey while educating, entertaining, and inspiring listeners.



As a couple, Cliff and Susan are not only partners in music but also in life. They are deeply rooted in their Arkansas community, and their love for music and each other shines through in everything they do. They are a shining example of the power of passion, hard work, and determination, and they continue to inspire and uplift others with their incredible talents. With their mission to support and elevate independent artists, there is no limit to the heights they can reach together as Cliff & Susan.

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August 2023 marked the 50th anniversary of a creative, expressive musical genre known as Hip Hop. With celebrations held all around the world to uplift and honor every aspect of Hip Hop culture, this golden anniversary has been a most extraordinary year.

We pause to look back on the beginnings, history, and the evolution of the ever-changing genre and the artists who made it a world-wide phenomenon.

Hip Hop is a genre of music most often characterized by a strong, rhythmic beat and a rapping vocal track. It was a cultural exchange among Black, Latino, and Caribbean youth and has grown into one of the most consumed genres of music in the United States. As a culture, Hip-Hop is built on four main pillars: DJing, rapping, breakdancing, and graffiti.

The time and place where Hip Hop originated was August 11, 1973, at 1520 Sedgwick Avenue, the Bronx, New York City. Eighteen-year-old Clive Campbell – better known as DJ Kool Herc - was the DJ at his sister's back-to-school party.

He extended the beat of a record by using two record players, isolating the percussion "breaks" by using a mixer to switch between the two records. Here's experiments with making music with record players became what we now know as breaking or "scratching." DJ Kool Here, of Jamaican background, is recognized as one of the earliest Hip Hop DJs and artists. He is widely credited with officially originating Hip Hop music through his 1973 "Back to School Jam."

Grand Wizzard Theodore, Grandmaster Flash, and Afrika Bambaataa began to experiment with different techniques during parties, including longer percussive breaks, turntable techniques, scratching, freestyle, and improvised vocals based on Jamaican "toasting." They're often credited as pioneers of modern Hip-Hop and Rap music.

Hip Hop music was not officially recorded for play on radio or television until 1979, largely due to poverty during the genre's birth and lack of acceptance outside ghetto neighborhoods. Old-school Hip Hop was the first mainstream wave of the genre, marked by its Disco influence and party-oriented lyrics. Puerto Rican DJ Disco Wiz is credited as the first Hip Hop DJ to create a "mixed plate," or mixed

dub recording, when, in 1977, he combined sound bites, special effects and paused beats to technically produce a sound recording.

The first Hip Hop record is widely regarded to be the Sugarhill Gang's *Rapper's Delight*, from 1979. It was the first Hip Hop radio hit to gain widespread popularity in the mainstream and was where Hip Hop music got its name (from the opening bar of the title track). The song became a Top 40 hit in January 1980.

In the 1980s, Hip Hop was in full force. Many different artists began bringing new ideas to the genre, including drum kits, more complex sampling, metaphorical rap lyrics, and broader collaboration with genres like electro music. The '80s also saw Hip-Hop spread to an international audience, especially across the UK, Japan, and Australia.

In 1984, several Hip Hop albums, especially from artists Run-DMC, LL Cool J, and the Beastie Boys, introduced what became called "new school Hip Hop." This style emphasized

drum machine beats, minimalism, shorter songs for radio play and socio-political commentary. These artists shifted away from the party rhymes and funk influences of "old school Hip Hop."

Young, black Americans coming out of the civil rights movement used Hip Hop culture in the 1980s and 90s to show the limitations of the Hip Hop movement. Hip Hop gave young African Americans a voice to let their issues be heard. Hip Hop was vigorously opposed by conservatives because it promoted violence, law-breaking, and gangs. It also gave people a chance for financial gain by reducing the rest of the world to consumers of its social concerns.



Clive Campbell, aka DJ Kool Herc, is revered as "The Father of Hip-Hop." This year, he was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Hip Hop had begun to move the music scene outside of New York City. It could be found in cities as diverse as Los Angeles, Atlanta, Chicago, Washington, D.C., Baltimore, Dallas, Kansas City, San Antonio, Miami, Seattle, St. Louis, New Orleans, Houston and Philadelphia, which The New York Times dubbed the "Graffiti Capital of the World" in 1971.

The late 1980s and early 1990s were the golden age of Hip Hop, in which many performers enjoyed huge mainstream success while introducing major innovations with each new record. Major artists included Public Enemy, Tupac Shakur, The Notorious B.I.G., MC Hammer, Boogie Down Productions, Snoop Dogg, Nas, A Tribe Called Quest, and Big Daddy Kane. The era also saw the rise of Gangsta Rap, a subgenre that emphasized the lifestyle of inner-city youth and was characterized by artists like Schoolly D, Ice-T, and N.W.A.



Stanley Burrell, better known as MC Hammer. He was an award-winning artist who hit his peak in the late 1980s and early 1990s as a Rap/Hip-Hop performer as well as a dancer and record producer.

By the late 1990s, Hip-Hop was a major mainstream genre and created many high-profile artists, including Lil Wayne, Timbaland, Nelly, Puff Daddy, Jay-Z, Ja Rule, DMX, Eminem, and 50 Cent. In 1995, the Grammys added a new award category for 'Best Rap Album'; it was awarded for the first time to Naughty by Nature.

MC Hammer hit mainstream success with the multiplatinum album "Please Hammer, Don't Hurt 'Em." The record reached No. 1 and the first single, *U Can't Touch This*. MC Hammer became one of the most successful rappers of the early nineties and one of the first household names in the genre. The album raised Rap music to a new level of popularity. It was the first Hip Hop album certified diamond by the RIAA for sales of over ten million. It remains one of the genre's all-time best-selling albums. To date, the album has sold as many as 18 million units.

Released in 1990, *Ice Ice Baby* by Vanilla Ice was the first Hip Hop single to top the charts in the U.S. It also reached number one in the UK and Australia, among others, and has been credited for helping diversify Hip Hop by introducing it to a mainstream audience.

In 1992, Dr. Dre released "The Chronic." This album founded a style called G Funk, which soon came to dominate West Coast Hip Hop. The style was further developed and popularized by Snoop Dogg's 1993 album "Doggystyle." Despite the lack of support from some black radio stations, Hip Hop became a best-selling music genre in the mid-1990s and the top selling music genre by 1999 with 81 million CDs sold.

The East Coast/West Coast Hip Hop rivalry was a feud between artists and fans of the East Coast Hip Hop and West Coast Hip Hop scenes in the United States, especially from 1994 to 1997. The feud was between East Coast-based rapper the Notorious B.I.G. (and his New York-based label, Bad Boy Records) and West Coast-based rapper Tupac Shakur (and his Los Angeles-based label, Death Row Records). This rivalry started before the rappers themselves hit the scene. Because New York is the birthplace of Hip Hop, artists from the West Coast felt as if they were not receiving the same media coverage and public attention as the East Coast. As time went on, both rappers began to grow in fame and as they both became more known the tensions continued to arise. Eventually both artists were fatally shot following drive-by shootings in 1997 and 1996, respectively.

By the late 1990s, Hip Hop was artistically dominated by the Wu-Tang Clan, Diddy, and the Fugees. The Beastie Boys continued their success throughout

the decade crossing color lines and gaining respect from many different artists. By the end of the decade, Hip Hop was an integral part of popular music, and many American Pop songs had Hip Hop components. The popularity of Hip Hop music continued through to the early 2000s "bling era" with Hip Hop influences increasingly finding their way into other genres of popular music, such as Neo Soul, Nu Metal, and R&B. The United States also saw the success of regional styles such as Crunk, a Southern genre that emphasized the beats and music more than the lyrics, and Alternative Hip Hop began to secure a place in the mainstream, due in part to the crossover success of its artists.

In the 2000s, many artists incorporated heavier influences from genres like Punk, Jazz, Indie Rock, and Electronic. During this time, prominent or rising artists included Outkast, Kanye West, MF Doom, 2 Chainz, Gucci Mane, Juicy J, The Roots, Kid Cudi, Mos Def, Drake, Aesop Rock, Kendrick Lamar, and Gnarls Barkley.

The rise of internet distribution and streaming services at the turn of the century and into the modern-day created an explosion of artists, mixtapes, and experimentation. Many of the rappers who achieved mainstream success at this time, such as Nelly, Puff Daddy, Jay-Z, the later career of Fat Joe and his Terror Squad, Mase, Ja Rule, Fabolous, and Cam'ron, had a Pop-oriented style, while others such as Big Pun, Fat Joe (in his earlier career), DMX, Eminem, 50 Cent and his G-Unit, and the Game enjoyed commercial success at this time with a grittier style.

Although white rappers like the Beastie Boys, House of Pain, and 3rd Bass previously had some popular success or critical acceptance from the Hip Hop community, Eminem's success, beginning in 1999 with the platinum "The Slim Shady" LP, surprised many. Hip hop influences also found their way increasingly into mainstream Pop during this period, particularly in genres such as R&B (e.g. R. Kelly, Akon, TLC, Destiny's Child, Beyoncé, Ashanti, Aaliyah, Usher), Neo Soul (e.g. Lauryn Hill, Erykah Badu, Jill Scott), and Nu Metal (e.g. Korn, Limp Bizkit).

Dr. Dre remained an important figure in this era, making his comeback in 1999 with the album "2001." In 2000, he produced "The Marshall Mathers" LP by Eminem, and also produced 50 Cent's 2003 album "Get Rich or Die Tryin'," which debuted at number one. Jay-Z represented the cultural triumph of Hip Hop in this era. As his career progressed, he went from performing artist to entrepreneur, label president, head of a clothing line, club owner, and market consultant.

By the late 2000s, alternative Hip Hop had secured its place within the mainstream. Industry observers view the sales race between Kanye West's "Graduation" and 50 Cent's "Curtis" as a turning point for Hip Hop. West sold nearly a million copies in the first week alone. While his decision to sing about love, loneliness, and heartache for the entirety of the album was at first heavily criticized by music audiences and the album was predicted to be a flop, its critical acclaim and commercial success encouraged other mainstream rappers to take greater creative risks with their music.

Due in part to the increasing use of music distribution through social media and blogging, many alternative and non-alternative rappers found acceptance by far-reaching audiences, known as the "blog era." Several artists, such as Kid Cudi and Drake, managed to attain chart-topping hit songs by releasing their music on free online mixtapes without the help of a major record label. Emerging artists at the time such as Wale, Kendrick Lamar, J. Cole, Lupe Fiasco, the Cool Kids, Jay Electronica, and B.o.B were noted by critics as expressing eclectic sounds, sensitive life experiences, and vulnerable emotions that were rarely seen in the prior bling era.

The rise of streaming platforms such as Spotify and Apple Music in the mid-late 2010s greatly impacted the entire music business as a whole. Despite being a free streaming-only mixtape with no commercial release, Chance the Rapper's "Coloring Book" won 'Best Rap Album' at the 2017 Grammy Awards, being the first streaming album ever to win a Grammy Award.

Major artists to arise from the genre in the 2010s include Lil Nas X, Waka Flocka Flame, Future, Chief Keef, Migos, Young Thug, Travis Scott, Kodak Black, among others. Female rappers Nicki Minaj, Cardi B, Saweetie, Doja Cat, Iggy Azalea, City Girls, and Megan Thee Stallion also entered the mainstream.

Country Rap (also called Country Hip Hop and mainstream Rap scene along with American popular music sometimes Hick Hop) combines compositions of Hip Hop figure Kanye West. Outside of the United States, there are with various forms of Country music. Such artists that have Christian Rap scenes in the UK, Australia, Brazil, Mexico

Although white rappers like the Beastie Boys, House of crossed both genres are Big Smo, Breland, Blanco Brown, and 3rd Bass previously had some popular success or Cowboy Troy, Ernest, Colt Ford, Kid Rock, and Jelly Roll.

Christian Hip Hop (originally Gospel Rap, also known as Christian Rap, Gospel Hip Hop or Holy Hip Hop) is a cross-genre of Contemporary Christian music and Hip Hop music. It emerged from Urban Contemporary music and Christian media in the United States during the 1980s. Christian Hip Hop music first emerged on record in 1982 with a track entitled *Jesus Christ (The Gospel Beat)* by Queens, New York artist, McSweet. The first full-length, Christian Hip Hop album, "Bible Break," by Oklahoma artist Stephen Wiley, was released in 1985 with the title track becoming a hit on Christian radio in 1986.



Ye, formerly known as Kanye West, is a multitalented rapper, songwriter, record producer, and fashion designer from the U.S. Rising to fame in the early 2000s, Ye is one of the world's bestselling music artists, with over 160 million records sold.

Other early Christian hip recording artists from the mid-1980s included P.I.D. (Preachas in Disguise), who recorded to funky Rock rhythms, as well as JC & the Boys and Michael Peace. During the 1990s and 2000s, rapper KJ-52 rose to prominence in the field. Christian Rock band DC Talk blended Hip Hop and Rock, and were successful in mainstream Christian music. All three band members have had successful independent careers, Michael Tait and Kevin Max Smith in Christian Pop, and TobyMac as a Christian Rapper and label owner. Along with Lecrae, NF, KB & Emcee N.I.C.E. who have emerged recently on the mainstream Rap scene along with American popular music figure Kanye West. Outside of the United States, there are Christian Rap scenes in the UK. Australia, Brazil, Mexico

and Canada. Asian, Black, and Latino rappers are becoming a major part of the genre, and this success is expanding the appeal of both Christian Hip Hop and Christian EDM within general Hip Hop and broader popular music.


In the last two years, the most streamed rappers were Doja Cat and Lil Nas X. Other rappers with high streams in were Drake, Eminem, Lil Baby, Polo G, Megan Thee Stallion, Cardi B, Moneybagg Yo, Masked Wolf, Pop Smoke, J. Cole, and Lil Durk.



Onika Tanya Minaj, aka Nicki Minaj, is the best selling female rapper of all time with over 100 million records sold. With her rapid-fire delivery and melodic voice, the rapper, singer, and actress holds her own with some of the most popular artists in the world.

The 2023 BET Hip Hop Awards aired October 10, on BET, and hosted by rapper Fat Joe. The show honored the best songs and videos of the year, as well as the industry's biggest and hardest-working hustlers, the most visible Hip Hop platforms and the most impactful tracks. Cardi B and 21 Savage led the nominations with an outstanding twelve nods each, while last year's big winner, Drake, followed close behind with nine nods. However, it was Kendrick Lamar who proved to be the night's big winner, going four-for-four and winning every category for which he was nominated. This year's star-studded celebration featured some big wins, emotional tributes and power performances - including a memorable tribute to the 50th anniversary of Hip Hop.





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
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ARTIST SPOTLIGHT

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

SHIRLEY CAESAR
QUEEN OF GOSPEL

Since leaving The Caravans - the hottest Gospel singing group in the land - and striking out on her own over fifty years ago, Shirley Caesar has been sweeping across America and the world, delivering her Christian message in electrifying song and sermon. She has picked twelve Grammy awards, eighteen Dove awards, fourteen Stellar awards, a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, and numerous other honors along her path. She has been a standardbearer for traditional African American Gospel music, yet at the same time has been unafraid to challenge convention and take the genre in daring new directions.



Born and raised in Durham, North Carolina, Caesar was greatly inspired by her father, Big Jim Caesar, a farmer who sang with an a cappella quartet. He died of a brain seizure when she was but ten. To help support her semi-invalid mother, Hallie Caesar, and a dozen brothers and sisters, she hit the road as a Gospel soloist with a one-legged evangelist named Leroy Johnson. Billed as Baby Shirley, at age thirteen she cut her first single, *I'd Rather Have Jesus*, backed with *I Know Jesus Will Save* for Federal Records.

"I got my call to the ministry when I was in college in 1957," says Caesar. Majoring in business administration at North Carolina College, she put her studies, along with her plans of becoming an evangelist, on hold when The Caravans, a fast-rising Gospel group from Chicago, passed through Durham the following year. They were minus a member, and Caesar convinced leader Albertina Walker that she knew all the parts. Walker was so impressed with what she heard; she

orn and raised in Durham, North Carolina, Caesar invited the teenager to join the group. Caesar moved to was greatly inspired by her father, Big Jim Caesar, Chicago and sang with The Caravans for the next eight years.

During her tenure, the group boasted other dynamic lead singers, most notably Inez Andrews, Cassietta George, and Dorothy Norwood. However, it was Caesar's emotionally galvanizing delivery and highly animated stage demeanor that were central in making The Caravans the most popular female Gospel group since the Ward Singers. Caesar's intense leads were featured on such Caravan hits as *Sweeping Through The City, No Coward Soldier, Holy Boldness*, and *Choose Ye This Dav*.

Caesar preached her first sermon in Chicago while a member of The Caravans, but on record, and in concert, her spoken testimony was limited to sermonettes within the bodies of songs such as *Hallelujah*, *Tis Done*. By the early 60s, during breaks in the group's schedule, she began getting offers to sing and preach apart from The Caravans. Sometimes

last-minute engagements would come along for the group, and Walker would ask Caesar to cancel her own dates. "I did not like disappointing people," Caesar says. "Tina would give me time off, and then dates would come in, but my first allegiance was to The Caravans. I knew that something would have to give."

Caesar finally left The Caravans in 1966, signing with Hobb Records, and began appearing as Evangelist Shirley Caesar. She recalls, "My first few months as a solo artist went so well that I called my mom and asked her to send Ann." Ann Caesar became a charter member of her sister's new background group, the Caesar Singers.

Shirley Caesar's solo saga has been a series of one triumph after another. In 1975, her Gospel version of *No Charge* (originally a #1 Country hit) crossed over to both the R&B and Pop charts. Three years later, "First Lady," her debut album for the United Artists/Roadshow label sold so well that it reached #36 on Billboard's R&B

album chart. Most notably her "Live In Chicago" album featuring her classic, *Hold My Mule* remained #1 on the Gospel charts for fifty-two weeks. Years later, her line from this song, *I Got Beans Greens Potatoes Tomatoes* went viral as an internet challenge, introducing her to a whole new audience.

Understandably, today Shirley Caesar is known as the 'Reigning Queen of Gospel.' Over the decades, Caesar has become easily the most visible Gospel singer in the world. She has collaborated on recordings with such artists as Aretha Franklin, Al Green, Whitney Houston, Michelle Williams, Patti LaBelle, Gladys Knight, Kirk Franklin, Dottie Peoples, Christian Rapper Tonex, and producer/singer J. Moss. She has also appeared on television in the series, "Good News,"

"Soul Food," "The Parkers," and "Family Time." She has been on Broadway in "This is My Song" and the "Born to Sing" trilogy. As well she appeared in motion pictures, "Gospel," "The Preacher's Wife," "Why Do Fools Fall In Love," "The Fighting Temptations," and "The Unseen." She has sung for every President since Jimmy Carter.

Caesar's plans of completing her education and becoming a minister, interrupted by her stint with The Caravans, eventually reached fruition. In 1984. She graduated Magna Cum Laude from Shaw University with a BA in business administration. She has honorary doctorates from Shaw University and Southeastern University, and she is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. In 1990, she was ordained as a pastor by her husband, Bishop Harold Ivory Williams. She currently serves as the Senior Pastor of Mount Calvary Word of Faith Church in Raleigh, North Carolina. Pastor Caesar has served on the City Council in Durham.

Pastor Shirley celebrated her 85th birthday on October 13, 2023. The 'Queen of Gospel Music' is also celebrating more than six decades of ministry this year. In a recent TV interview, she told ABC 11 in Durham, North Carolina, "It's been hard, but yet rewarding. There were some times I would scream... and when I just wanted to go somewhere and hide. But I'm still here."

Caesar told Eyewitness News she couldn't fathom how she's been able to accumulate the awards, fanfare, and life-changing and soul-fulfilling work as an artist and a pastor. "Had anyone ever told me that I would have a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame," she continued, "Here I am a little chocolate girl from North Carolina. I would not have believed it. But, God! Always remember that."

Pastor Caesar continues to keep going for The Lord. "I'm working on the next 50! Can I get a witness?" she laughed.

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














Artist Spotlight **ELEYET McCONNELL**

to the traditional music of Appalachia and the places where Bluegrass was born. "I get inspiration from my farm in Eastern Kentucky. I have thoroughly absorbed the music, culture, and influences of that storied region, and in the process, made them my own. There is something special when wood, strings, and voice unite in song. There is an authenticity that digital effects cannot cover up. It is simple, plain, pure, and perfect."

Although, the singing came much earlier and perhaps without Marty even recognizing it. A football player in high school earned the bad boy his share of detentions. Sitting in the detention room, the choir director at the school walked in to recruit males to join choir. The incentive was to get out of detention if they would join the choir; Marty learned to sing,

From living in Appalachia, Marty has a connection and it became a passion. During his "get out of jail free" time, Marty performed Messiah by George Frideric Handel, Magnificat in D Major by Johann Sebastian Bach, as well as in musicals like Fiddler on the Roof and Jesus Christ Superstar. From there he joined a barbershop quartet, a Pop ensemble, and the orchestra. The best part for Marty was getting an A for just showing up, where he carried his talents on to tenth grade. There he would put together a 50s Rock and Roll Doo-Wop group, covering Dion's Teenager in Love and the Silhouettes' Get a Job.

> A month's home stay recovering from mononucleosis, Marty learned the Stephen Stills guitar parts to Suite: Judy Blue Eyes. "I tried to master all three harmonies, singing along to Crosby, Stills, and Nash." After memorizing the song, Falle and his two friends, Ron and Lenny took the song to the high



school talent show, performing in front of the entire school. Crosby, Stills, and Nash, The Everly Brothers, Three Dog Night, and The Eagles (emulating Glenn Frey) were all big influences, "The music that formed a cornerstone of the late 60s and early 70s became further ingrained into my consciousness. These boyhood heroes, unknowingly, helped me to develop skills for this future singer and songwriter."

Marty continues, "I remember going to the Fur Peace Ranch Guitar Camp in Meigs County Ohio for a week. Studying under Bill Kirchen, Chris Hillman, and Jorma Kaukonen, I remember Jorma picking me up and taking me to his "guitar cottage" where hundreds of guitars were stored. He let me pick out any guitar that I wanted to use that week. I so remember the anxiety of performing in front of these greats on the last day of camp. I performed *Friend of the Devil*, with two other campers, in three-part harmony. The whole time I was thinking of Jerry Garcia writing and playing, Workingman's Dead, Jorma's Hot Tuna, and Chris' Flying Burrito Brothers and Manassas; wondering what each would think.

Marty became interested in Bluegrass while watching re-runs of "The Andy Griffith Show," especially those episodes featuring the music of a fictional band called The Darlings (who were, in truth, the now revered ensemble better known as The Dillards). Marty's fascination with the form grew from there. "I became more interested in Bluegrass while living in Athens, Ohio. At the Blue Eagle Music store, I would listen to guys playing banjo, fiddle, mandolin, and dobro." After graduation from Ohio University, Marty came back to the Eastern Kentucky coal country. "That is where Country and Bluegrass music hit me hard!"

Marty became a traveling law book salesman, where the locals would take him in and introduce him to bourbon and Bluegrass in Renfro Valley. "I wore out my CDs of Dwight Yoakam (especially "Guitars, Cadillacs"), Steve Earle, Keith Whitley, and Bill Monroe in my pick-up truck travelling down the roads of Pikeville, Harlan, Hazard, and Paintsville. I absorbed the Bakersfield sound, which of course included Buck Owens. Those experiences made a lingering impression. Real Appalachia influences my songwriting to this day."

Marty fronted cover bands as a singer and guitar player. "It was fun for a while, but deep down inside, I wanted to be 100% Marty, whatever that was. God gave me a talent, a gift. It was up to me to actualize that gift." Marty went all in with his first record, "Ohio" and has been doing originals ever since. The video, Hoochie Coochie Gal from the Buckeye State, recorded with friends and a talented line dance group, went viral and soared to three-million views. CMT featured the song on primetime, blowing Marty away but realizing he had made the right decision to be an original.

Marty would face his biggest challenge in the fight against advanced prostate cancer. "I remember going to the oncologist to find out the biopsy results and asking God for courage. While I was waiting, I kept reciting Psalm 23:4, 'Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.' Deuteronomy 31:6, 'Be strong and of a good courage, fear not, nor be afraid of them: for the Lord your God, he it is that doth go with thee; he will not fail thee, nor forsake thee.' I felt the Lord's presence in the room when they gave the news, 'You have cancer.' It gave me tremendous comfort."

A radical surgery, a serious setback, the return of cancer, the loss of his college roommate, a best friend, and his brother-in-law seemed insurmountable grief walls, leaving Marty wondering about his future. Would there be a future? Would he ever record again? Through all of the wonderings, he never stopped writing. With a good medical report in hand, Falle reached out to his Nashville team and set a date for recording.

Marty's new record is titled, "My Farm, My Bluegrass." In his own words, Falle describes his latest accomplishment. "It took an exceptional group of musicians to bring "My Farm, My Bluegrass" to fruition. Along with my producer, Jonathan Yudkin, all but assured that success by assembling an all-star band to back me up as I sang lead, backing vocals, and played rhythm guitar. Yudkin contributed fiddle and mandolin, while overseeing an erstwhile ensemble that included Carl Miner (guitar), Michael Bub (acoustic bass), Rob Ikes (dobro), Josh Matheny (dobro, lap steel, mandolin), Matt Menefee (banjo),

and Tim Carter (banjo). Additionally, Marty Slayton, Kim Parent, and Marcia Ramirez contributed backing vocals. Dale Ann Bradley shares lead vocals on *Ode to Ale 8*, *Chimney* Letters, and Praise the Lord and Pass the Gravy. The album's cover art was the work of Disney artist, Tom (TJ) Matousek. Each of these individuals boast distinguished résumés that not only confirm the fact that they are tops in their respective fields, but also offer a testament to a clear musical mantra. I made it my mission to weave together Bluegrass basics and ensure an enduring and indelible connection to the culture and heritage of my Eastern Kentucky environs." As of September 23, 2023, "My Farm, My Bluegrass" (released on August 28th) has been at #1 for twenty-seven straight days on APD (Air Play Direct) Global Top Bluegrass/Folk Albums. Deservingly so, Marty Falle and the album have been spotlighted in "The Bluegrass Standard," "Bluegrass Today," and "Country Music International" magazines.



On the new single, Ode to Ale 8, "It is my favorite soft drink and 100% Eastern Kentucky, a hundred-year-old company in Winchester, Kentucky. I own a two-hundred-acre farm in the Eastern coal country; while working one day, I was drinking Ale-8 and started humming a melody. I asked Dale Ann Bradley, an Eastern Kentucky Bluegrass legend, to track the vocals with me, and she was happy to join in. It is simple and silly." *Ode to Ale 8* became an immediate Top 10

hit on Bluegrass radio, entering the Top 5 on the Roots Music Contemporary Bluegrass chart, placing the album at Bluegrass Jamboree Top 100 for powerhouse "Rick Dollar Show" song in the nation.

Faith and family are the most important things in Marty's life. Raised in a Catholic environment, he respects the traditions of the Catholic Church, but became uninspired by the repetitive nature of the weekly Mass. "I wanted a direct connection to God, not necessarily through any particular religion." Upon a friend's suggestion, Marty began attending a small non-denominational church, Grace Church. The services focused on the Bible and how it relates to modern living. Each seat had a Bible underneath it, encouraging all to take a Bible and take notes. The passage for this day was Philippians 3:14. "I had tears in my eyes as I furiously took notes, because it made sense to me. For the first time, there was no confusion. As my father had just passed away, I leaned heavily on what I was learning in order to overcome the grief. There are many Bible passages, but none are more impactful to me than Philippians 3:14."

Perhaps unaware, Marty preaches a bit, "Once a person is born again, they grow in grace from the lifelong pursuit to know the Lord. We press on towards the goal of his calling. Each believer has a specific purpose that God has called them to achieve. It is unique to each person. It is an imperfect journey, filled with disappointments and challenges. The key is to press on through it all and forget what is behind, ever looking forward to what is ahead. Let go of bitterness and conflict that can slow you down. Do the best that you can. Understand that you are flawed. Most importantly, do not stop in the pursuit of knowing Christ. Press on!" And the church said, "Amen."

Marty has written a few hundred songs in his life, but none have been more inspirational or important as The Calling. Basically a 7:20 prayer, it is based on Philippians 3:14. "It has served me well over the years, especially on my last day of radiation following my second round with cancer. The radiation staff let me ring the bell and gave me a diploma for getting through, which meant more to me than my college diploma. I then listened to *The Calling*." The song was never intended to be released to the public until a conversation with Annette Grady, founder of the Bluegrass Jamboree. She convinced Falle to share the message that so many are needing to hear. The Calling is included on "My Farm, My Bluegrass."

Nevertheless, Marty Falle insists that he never really intended to pursue music. "Music has always had a strong hold on me, but I have no interest in making it big, whatever that really means. I never did. I have met plenty of A-list artists who are miserable. My dreams came true a long time ago. I have a loving and supporting family. I am blessed to

have made five original records. I have worked with many of Nashville's best and brightest. I have made a ton of friends. I have a great big smile on my face. My goals have been achieved. The rest is gravy."




Furthermore, "I am not interested in touring at this time. I have been invited to play some larger festivals worldwide, but graciously declined. I am in full-on creative mode of writing, singing, and recording. I truly believe that each song

idea is a gift from God, and I do not want to waste one opportunity to create it. At some point, I will play each of my original Bluegrass records in their entirety in Nashville, on a soundstage. I like the idea of getting the same group, in the same room on video, similar to something I did for European TV. After that, I would like to perform in some selected shows. I do miss the time on stage, but I do not miss the travel and the preparation that goes with touring. There is a season for everything, and right now I am in the season of creating music."

The planning is in the works for "My Farm, My Bluegrass" to be performed, in its entirety, live for TV taping at SIR Nashville Soundstage, as well as a live recording at The Station Inn Nashville.

Just like *Ale-8*, a long, simple and satisfying career regains its course for this original who has already written the songs for a "next" album. Marty Falle, "This is just who I am."



























Artist Spotlight **EDDY MANN**



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
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

Jimmy Buffett
December 25, 1946 – September 1, 2023

With a recording career that spanned more than fifty years and included hits such as *Margaritaville, Come Monday,* and *It's Five O'Clock Somewhere*, Buffett was one of the most successful performers in popular music. He filled arenas with fans who called themselves "Parrot Heads," and popularized a signature blend of Folk, Country and Caribbean music with lyrics that often reflected Buffett's world travels. A pilot and a sailor, Buffett wrote songs about his plane being shot at by Jamaican police (*Jamaica Mistaica*), getting lost in the Sahara Desert (*Buffet Hotel*) and smugglers he had known around the Florida Gulf Coast (*A Pirate Looks at 40*).

Although he was best known for upbeat party songs (others include *Cheeseburger in Paradise*, and *Fins*), Buffett first achieved notoriety for thoughtful ballads that showed the influence of Texas songwriters such as Jerry Jeff Walker and Canadian Gordon Lightfoot.

Bob Dylan praised lesser-known Buffett compositions *He Went to Paris* and *Death of an Unpopular Poet* - songs that reflected the observational, storytelling skills Buffett developed in his early career as a journalist for Billboard magazine.

Buffett had a second career as a successful author. He was one of a handful of writers who had number one bestsellers on both the fiction and non-fiction lists of the New York Times Book Review. He had a third career as an entrepreneur, building a diversified lifestyle brand business, including Margaritaville hotels, restaurants, and retirement communities, along with sidelines such as Land Shark beer. Buffett's branding and business acumen made him one of the most financially successful musicians of all time.

James William Buffett was born on Christmas, 1946 in Pascagoula, Mississippi and grew up in Alabama. He earned a bachelor's degree in history from the University of Southern Mississippi in 1969. He credited early years playing and singing in the streets and bars of New Orleans with shaping his dedication to connecting with his audience and giving the customers a good show. Buffett had little patience with performers who took themselves too seriously. He liked to say that the job of singing for a living was descended from the profession of court jester.


The beloved singer-songwriter passed away at his home in Sag Harbor, Long Island on Friday September 1, 2023, surrounded by family and friends. Buffett, 76, had been fighting Merkel Cell Skin Cancer for four years. He continued to perform during treatment, playing his last show, a surprise appearance in Rhode Island, in early July.

Richard Davis

April 15, 1930 - September 6, 2023

Richard Davis was born in Chicago in 1930 and quickly discovered a passion for music. He studied double bass as a teen and was eventually a member of Chicago Youth Symphony Orchestras. For twenty-three years, he lived in New York City and made a name for himself as one of the world's premier bass players. From 1967 to 1974, Downbeat International Critics Poll named him "Best Bassist."

In 1977, he settled down in Madison, becoming a professor of bass, Jazz, and ensemble at UW, where he taught for decades. He and his first graduate student, Peter Dominguez, created the Richard Davis Foundation for Young Bassists in the '90s. The Foundation holds annual master classes for musicians between the ages of three and eighteen. More than once, Davis hosted the conference in his own home.



Davis was also an advocate in the Madison community; in 1998, he created the Retention Action Project, which facilitated open dialogues on race and culture. In 2000, he founded Madison's Institutes for the Healing of Racism, which aims to raise consciousness about the history and pathology of racism and foster racial unity. Jesse Dirkman is a facilitator at the Institutes. She says that Davis was an invaluable resource: "He was always just so generous with his time and his stories."

A bandleader in his own right, Davis played with a bevy of top Jazz musicians. A small sampling: Eric Dolphy, Elvin Jones, Archie Shepp, Dorothy Ashby, Roland Kirk, Pharoah Sanders. And he performed with musicians outside the Jazz world including Bruce Springsteen, Van Morrison, Frank Sinatra, and Barbra Streisand.

Renowned Jazz musician Richard Davis passed away on September 6, 2023, at the age of 93, after spending several years in hospice care.

Robert "Bob" Feldman

June 14, 1940 - August 23, 2023)

Born June 14, 1940, in Brooklyn, New York, Bob Feldman was once a member of the All-City Choir with Neil Diamond and Barbra Streisand. Along with his friend Jerry Goldstein, the two co-wrote a theme song for the Alan Freed TV show, The Big Beat, in 1959 before meeting songwriter Richard Gottehrer in 1962. The three went on to write a number of hits throughout the 1960s and also formed their group The Strangeloves in 1964.

After relocating to the West Coast in 1966, Feldman produced records for artists such as The Belmonts and Surf Rock legend Link Wray.

Robert "Bob" Feldman, a singer, songwriter, and producer, best known for writing a catalog of hits such as *My Boyfriend's Back, I Want Candy*, and *Sorrow* with his writing partners Jerry Goldstein and Richard Gottehrer, passed away on August 23, 2023. He was 83.



Davis was also an advocate in the Madison community; "The memories of the times we shared; the songs we in 1998, he created the Retention Action Project, which wrote and the adventures that filled our lives remain," facilitated open dialogues on race and culture. In 2000, he Gottehrer said. "Sooner or later we'll all pass, but the music founded Madison's Institutes for the Healing of Racism, will live on. Rest in peace, Bob. We'll meet again."

"As a team, we go back to the 1960s and the Brill Building days, where we wrote and/or produced classics like My Boyfriend's Back, I Want Candy, Hang on Sloopy and Sorrow, which was eventually recorded and became an everlasting hit by David Bowie," added Gottehrer. "We were even an 'Australian' band that called ourselves The Strangeloves," Per American Songwriter.



Ronnie Eugene Gaddis July 15, 1955- August 24, 2023

Ronnie Eugene Gaddis of Louisville, Kentucky was a talented musician and a loyal friend to many. He was born on July 15, 1955, in Louisville, Kentucky to Ralph and Eugenia Gaddis then was lovingly raised by Eugenia and Fred Smith.

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



Ron was a singer and a bassist who played with many Country music legends, most notably George Jones. He was George's bass player and background vocalist for over 25 years, and also sang duets with him on stage. He was known for his powerful voice and his ability to harmonize with George like no one else. He wrote and recorded his own songs such as Chip Off The Old Block, a tribute to George Jones.

Ron loved music and shared his passion with everyone he met. He was a kind and generous man who always had a smile on his face.

At age 68, Ron passed away on August 24, 2023. He is greatly missed by all who knew him.



Ron Haffkine
December 13, 1938 - October 1, 2023

Ron Haffkine was instrumental in getting Dr. Hook signed by Clive Davis at Columbia Records in the 1970s, and the band led by Dennis Locorriere, George Cummings, the eyepatch-wearing Ray Sawyer and Billy Francis would compile a string of hits that included *Sylvia's Mother, Cover of the Rolling Stone, Sharing the Night Together, When You're in Love With a Beautiful Woman, Sexy Eyes, Baby Makes Her Blue Jeans Talk and A Little Bit More.*

Haffkine produced ten Dr. Hook studio albums and two live albums and also worked with the likes of Waylon Jennings, Lou Rawls, Mac Davis and Helen Reddy. He also often collaborated with singer, songwriter and poet Shel Silverstein. He won a Grammy Award in 1985 for producing Silverstein's "Where the Sidewalk Ends" and received another Grammy nom two years later for his work on another Silverstein children's album, "A Light in the Attic."

Born in New York on December 13, 1938, Haffkine contracted polio when he was twelve, leaving him paralyzed for two years. Later, he and Silverstein became friends in Greenwich Village. Silverstein asked him to produce music he had written for the films Ned Kelly (1970), starring Mick

Jagger, and Who Is Harry Kellerman and Why Is He Saying Those Terrible Things About Me? (1971), starring Dustin Hoffman and Barbara Harris.

Haffkine recommended that Dr. Hook be used in Harry Kellerman, but for that to happen, the New Jersey band had to have a record deal. After the musicians did an impromptu live showcase in Davis' office and were signed, Dr. Hook performed the Silverstein-written songs *Bunky and Lucille* and *Last Morning* in the movie.

Ron also produced Silverstein's 1972 music comedy album "Freakin' at the Freakers' Ball," with Dr. Hook handling the title track, and recorded the quirky Silverstein song *Do You Want to Boogie or Do You Don't* that year as well.

Ron Haffkine died Sunday, October 1, 2023, at his home in Mexico after a brief bout with leukemia and kidney failure. He was 83 years old. His friend of fifty years, music executive Joel Diamond, told The Hollywood Reporter, "Ron always had an uncanny knack of hearing a hit song in its rawest stage and the rare talent to couple it with the best musicians and then top it off with a meticulous performance by the artist."



Steven Scott Harwell
January 9, 1967 – September 4, 2023

Born in California in 1967, Steve Harwell performed in a rap group called F.O.S. (Freedom of Speech) before forming Smash Mouth in 1994. The band released two platinum albums on Interscope Records, their ska-fueled 1997 debut "Fush Yu Mang" and 1999's "Astro Lounge." The second album featured some of the band's biggest hits, including the Grammy-nominated, platinum single *All Star*, which appeared in the movie "Shrek" alongside their cover of the Monkees' *I'm a Believer*. Smash Mouth is also known for hits including *Walkin' on the Sun* and *Then The Morning Comes*.

Humor was a driving force behind Smash Mouth's success, and at the forefront was Harwell's playful Alt-Rock voice and persona. He made a cameo in 2001 comedy film "Rat Race," and had a well-documented friendship with the Food Network chef and host Guy Fieri.

Harwell retired from performing and left Smash Mouth in 2021. The band continued to tour with Zach Goode as the singer. Smash Mouth released a statement at the time saying Harwell had been diagnosed with cardiomyopathy eight years earlier and had suffered "nonstop serious medical setbacks including heart failure as well as acute Wernicke directions in life and pursue Christian ministry in the 1980s. Encephalopathy."

Harwell passed away on Monday, September 4, 2023 surrounded by family and friends at his home in Boise, Idaho, He was 56. The band's manager, Robert Hayes, stated the cause of death was acute liver failure.

"Steve Harwell was a true American Original. A largerthan-life character who shot up into the sky like a Roman candle," Hayes said. "Steve should be remembered for his unwavering focus and impassioned determination to reach the heights of Pop stardom. His only tools were his irrepressible charm and charisma, his fearlessly reckless ambition," Hayes said, adding: "Steve lived a 100% fullthrottle life, burning brightly across the universe before burning out. He will be greatly missed by those who knew and loved him."



Rudolph "Rudy" Bernard Isley April 1, 1939 - October 11, 2023

Rudolph Isley was born in 1939, in Cincinnati, Ohio. In just fifteen years, Rudolph began what would become a world-renowned band called The Isley Brothers. Three of his siblings, Kelly, Vernon, and Ronald, all took part in the upstart band. Unfortunately, Vernon died as a teenager in 1955 shortly after the band got started.

The brothers stuck together though, and by 1959, The Isley Brothers had produced their first song to reach the music

charts. They titled the hit, Shout. They were certainly not stopping there. In 1962, the brothers produced a cover for the song Twist and Shout, which initially gained the song substantial traction. The Beatles then performed a cover of Twist and Shout a year later, launching the song into even more success.

In 1970, the brothers won a Grammy with a fan favorite, It's Your Thing. The group was eventually introduced into the Songwriter's Hall of Fame.

Following all of this success, Rudolph chose to change Rudolph was loved by many and will be remembered for his impact on music and the lives he touched during his time in ministry.

Rudolph Isley passed away on the morning of Monday, October 11, 2023. The exact cause of Isley's death has not yet been confirmed; however, it is believed he passed due to a heart attack. Isley's attorney shared that: "He died at his home, with his devoted wife Elaine by his side. They had been married for 68 years. Rudolph was a deeply religious man who loved Jesus."



Terry Robert Kirkman December 12, 1939 - September 23, 2023

Terry Robert Kirkman was born in Salina, Kansas, on December 12, 1939, and was raised in Chino, California. Both his parents had a musical background. His father Gordon had performed in bands as a soprano saxophone player and singer, and his mother Lois played the organ and piano at church and in silent film theaters.


Kirkman first learned how to play brass instruments as a child, during the second world war. After graduating from Chino High School in 1957, he attended Chaffey College as a music major. He met Frank Zappa in college, and they performed together at local coffeehouses from 1959 to 1961.



Kirkman moved to Los Angeles with his friend Jules Alexander in 1963 and founded the Folk group the Inner Tubes, which at one time included both Cass Elliot and David Crosby. The Inner Tubes slowly grew from a small group into a 13-piece band called the Men.

The Men disbanded in February 1965 and Kirkman and five other members formed their own band, The Association. The Folk-Rock group peaked two years later with a string of recordings that included *Along Comes Mary, Never My Love* and *Everything That Touches You*.

Known for their sharp sense of style and smooth harmonies, The Association opened the 1967 Monterey Pop Festival, recognized as the first commercial American Rock festival, with a bill including Jimi Hendrix and the Who, Janis Joplin, Jefferson Airplane, the Grateful Dead, the Byrds, Canned Heat, and many more. They held their own among the legends of Rock, onlookers noted at the time.

Kirkman wrote several hits for the Association, including *Cherish, Everything That Touches You, and Six Man Band,* and played a variety of wind, brass and percussion instruments on their recordings.

Kirkman left The Association at the end of 1972, following the release of seven albums, led by their 1966 debut "And Then... Along Comes the Association." He returned to the fold in 1979, splitting once more in 1984 - having had enough of relentless touring.

The early '80s reunion included recording sessions which followed an appearance on the HBO special Then and Now. The Association did release a couple of singles for Elektra around that time - including *Dreamer*, which hit charts in 1981.

Over the years, The Association was nominated for six Grammy Awards and earned a Golden Globe nomination in 1970 for best original song, with *Goodbye Columbus*.

Various incarnations of the band continue to perform, and their albums have achieved three platinum and six gold RIAA certifications, according to the Association's official site, with its "Greatest Hits" (via Warner Brothers) now double platinum.

Kirkman passed away September 23, 2023, at his home in Montclair, California from congestive heart failure following a long illness. He was 83.

Charlie Robison

September 1, 1964 - September 10, 2023

Robison launched his music career in the late 1980s, playing in local Austin bands like Two Hoots and a Holler before forming his own Millionaire Playboys. In 1996, he released his solo debut album, "Bandera," named for the Texas Hill Country town where his family has had a ranch for generations.

When he was approached by Sony in 1998, Robison signed with its Lucky Dog imprint, which was devoted to rawer Country. His 2001 album "Step Right Up" produced his only Top 40 Country song, *I Want You Bad*.



In 2018, Robison announced that he had permanently lost the ability to sing following a surgical procedure on his throat. "Therefore, with a very heavy heart I am officially retiring from the stage and studio," he wrote on Facebook.

Robison served as a judge for one year on USA Network's "Nashville Star," a reality TV show in which contestants lived together while competing for a Country music recording contract.

Robison's breakup with Emily Strayer from the Dixie Chicks inspired songs on the 2009 album, "Beautiful Day." He recorded it while living across from the Greyhound bus station in San Antonio, in a loft apartment with mismatched furniture and strewn beer bottles, "the quintessential bachelor pad," he recalled. "People come up to me and say they're going through something right now, and it's like this is completely written about them," Robison told The Associated Press in 2009. "I wasn't meaning to do that, but it's been a residual effect of the record."

Robison's final album, the rock-tinged "High Life" from 2013, included a cover version of Bob Dylan's *When I Paint My Masterpiece*.

On September 10, 2023, Robison died at a hospital in San Antonio after suffering cardiac arrest and other complications, according to a family representative.

Katherine Anderson-Schaffner January 16, 1944 - September 19, 2023

Katherine Anderson-Schaffner was a founding member of the Marvelettes – the group behind the classic *Please, Mr. Postman*, a song that stayed on the music charts for an astounding 23 weeks in 1961, eventually reaching #1 on the charts in December.

It all started when she was one of five schoolmates who formed a girl group to sing in a talent show in 1961. She was already a veteran of the Inkster High School glee club in Inkster, Michigan, and the talent show offered a Motown



audition to the winners. Schaffner and her friends came in fourth, but they managed to finagle an audition anyway in a move that was as auspicious for Motown as it was for the young women. The label signed the group, renamed them the Marvelettes, and almost immediately released their debut single, *Please Mr. Postman*, while they were about to start their senior year of high school. The song became Motown's first No. 1 Pop hit and has remained a classic of the era.

The Marvelettes continued releasing hits, including Playboy, Beechwood 4-5789, Too Many Fish in the Sea, Don't Mess with Bill, and The Hunter Gets Captured by the Game.

The group's membership evolved over the course of the 1960s, but Schaffner remained one of its core members, along with Wanda Young (1943–2021) and Gladys Horton (1945–2011). When the group disbanded in 1969, Anderson continued working as a songwriter for Motown for a short time, then left the music business to focus on her family.

Katherine Anderson-Schaffner passed away on September 20, 2023, at a hospital in Dearborn, Michigan, of heart failure at the age of 79.

Anderson-Schaffner's sister made the following post on social media following the beloved singer's passing: "Some called her Kat - some called her Sis , Gamma - Momma K, but my sister and I called her MOM," she wrote in her tribute post. "She was not just a mom to us but to many. Many people would come and sit at her table. Now if you ever sat and said, 'Kat I need to talk.' You already knew you were going to get true, uncut, unedited council. She wasn't going to tell you what you wanted to hear but what you should hear. I remember friends saying I'm coming over and I would say, 'I'm not home;' the response would be 'I'm going to talk to your mom.' My response would always be 'you know how that's going to go, right?' Two hours and a box of tissue later sitting at her kitchen table, your counseling session was over. The funny part is you would come back for more."

"Katherine Anderson-Schaffner is and will always be one of the original Marvelettes. Her music and legacy will live

on. So, the next time you hear *Please Mr. Postman, Don't Mess With Bill*, or *The Hunter Gets Captured By The Game*, just smile and say 'I'll Keep Holding On.' Mom, we love you and will miss you. And yes, we know – 'It is what it is.'"



John Thomas "Jack" Sonni December 9, 1954 - August 30, 2023

John Thomas Sonni was born on December 9, 1954, in Indiana, Pennsylvania. He was drawn to music at an early age, first learning piano. Sonni was studying literature at the University of Connecticut. The multi-instrumentalist's passion for music prompted him to transfer to the Hartford Conservatory of Music. There, the pianist, trumpet player, and guitarist further honed the craft he had been working on since he was a child.

Sonni moved to New York in the 1970s, working as a session musician and performing with his own band, the Leisure Class. In 1978, while working at Rudy's Music Stop, owned by renowned luthier Rudy Pensa, he met the members of Dire Straits and formed a friendship. Six years later, when David Knopfler and Hal Lindes left the band, Mark Knopfler asked Sonni to step in.

Sonni became known as "the other guitarist" with Dire Straits, recording "Brothers in Arms" with the band and touring for the album. "Brothers in Arms" was a huge success, selling 30 million copies worldwide and spawning hits like *Money for Nothing* and *Walk of Life*. On July 13, 1985, he played the Live Aid concert with the band. Sonni retired from music in 1988, after the birth of his twin daughters.


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In 2001, he became vice president of marketing communication for Guitar Center. In the summer of 2006, Sonni left Guitar Center to write books, moving to San Jose del Cabo, then California. He was writer-in-residence and house manager at the Noepe Center for Literary Arts on Martha's Vineyard until its closure in 2017. Jack had also returned to playing music on a regular basis with his band The Leisure Class.

The Dire Straits guitarist, Jack Sonni passed away on August 30, 2023, at the age of 68.



Charles Wilburn ("Buck") Trent February 17, 1938 - October 9, 2023

Born Charles Wilburn Trent in Spartanburg, South Carolina, Buck began playing Hawaiian guitar when he was seven years old. He also played dobro, mandolin, electric bass, guitar, and most notably, five-string banjo. He started performing on radio at age ten. When he was seventeen, he was featured on the TV show of Cousin Wilbur (Westbrooks) in Asheville, North Carolina.

He moved to California, where he performed on Town Hall Party, Hometown Jamboree, and other west coast Country shows. He then fronted his own bands in San Angelo, Texas and Atlanta (on WJFB-TV). Next, he moved to Nashville and joined the road show of Opry star Bill Carlisle in 1959. After serving a brief stint with Bill Monroe, he joined Porter Wagoner's Wagonmasters in 1962. This is where he developed his electric-banjo innovation alongside steel-guitar maestro Shot Jackson.

The Porter Wagoner Show was the top nationally syndicated Country music show of the 1960s. The show also included comic Speck Rhodes, dancing fiddler Mack Magaha, and spectacular "girl singer" Parton. Trent played on all of the hit duets recorded by Wagoner and Parton, as well as on her solo LPs. He urged her to record *Mule Skinner Blues*, which became her first top 10 hit (1970). Those are his

distinctively rhythmic acoustic-guitar licks opening Dolly Parton's iconic *Jolene*. He also played on the singer's original version of *I Will Always Love You* and on Parton's albums "Coat of Many Colors" (1973), "My Tennessee Mountain Home" (1973) and "Rainbow" (1987), among others.

Trent remained with the Wagonmasters through 1973. He spent the next seven years with Roy Clark. They were part of the first Country music road show to tour the Soviet Union (1976). He and fellow instrumental great Clark created several dazzling duet performances. They were named the CMA's 'Instrumental Group of the Year' in 1975 and 1976.

When Clark joined the Hee Haw cast, so did Trent. He remained with the show for nineteen years. This higher profile led to a number of solo albums showcasing his instrumental gifts. He recorded for the Smash, RCA, Boone, Dot and ABC labels, as well as for his own imprint. Among his best-known collections were "Bionic Banjo" (1976), "Oh Yeah!" (1977) and "Buck Trent" (1986).

In the 1990s, Buck became a headliner in Branson, Missouri. Between 2008 and 2015, he was featured on The Marty Stuart show. He recorded with the future Country Music Hall of Famer on the 2012 CD "Tear the Woodpile Down."

He embarked on the 2018 "Kornfield Friends" Hee Haw reunion tour alongside former show regulars Lulu Roman, Misty Rowe, and Jana Jae. Trent's final album, "Spartanburg Blues," was released in 2018.

Buck Trent passed away in Branson, Missouri on Monday morning, October 9th. He was 85. His ebullient personality and infectious on-stage energy were matched by unparalleled musicianship. The latter was displayed on dozens of records. He made fifteen solo albums and was also heard on albums by Wagoner, Nancy Sinatra, Mac Wiseman, Wilma Lee & Stoney Cooper, Norma Jean, Johnnie & Jack, Roy Clark, and many others.


The music industry not only mourns the passing of a remarkable musician but also celebrates a life that brought immense joy through the power of music. His legacy will continue to inspire future generations of artists and Country music enthusiasts, ensuring that his memory lives on in the heartfelt melodies of the genre he cherished. Buck Trent may have left this world, but his music will forever resonate in the hearts of those who loved and admired him.

Gary Malcolm Wright

April 26, 1943 - September 4, 2023

Gary Wright was born in Cresskill, New Jersey. His father was a construction engineer, and his mother was a singer, as were his two sisters. His older sister, Beverly, enjoyed some success as a Pop and Folk singer in the 60s, while his younger sister, Lorna, released the album "Circle of Love" (1978) and several singles.

His mother encouraged him to take an interest in music and acting. At the age of seven, he appeared in the TV sci-fi series Captain Video and His Video Rangers, and when he



was twelve he was hired as an understudy for a Broadway musical, Fanny. This resulted in him going on stage in the role of Cesario, son of the titular Fanny, played by Florence Ed Sullivan Show.

His enthusiasm subsequently switched to music, and while at Tenafly High School in New Jersey, he played in several Rock'n'Roll groups. He would cite R&B artists Ray Charles, Aretha Franklin, and James Brown among his musical idols, along with Elvis Presley, Jerry Lee Lewis, and the Beatles.

Having attended college in Virginia and then focused on medicine at New York University, Wright was studying psychology at the Free University of Germany in West Berlin when he abandoned his academic plans and formed a group called the New York Times. They supported the English group Traffic at a gig in Oslo, where he met the Island Records boss Chris Blackwell. Blackwell introduced Wright to four of the five members of the now-defunct band Art, and Spooky Tooth was formed. Traffic's producer Jimmy Miller worked on their first two albums, It's All About and Spooky Two (1969).

Wright left the band, but in 1972 got together with another original member, Mike Harrison, and rebuilt it with a new lineup. They recorded You Broke My Heart So ... I Busted Your Jaw (1973), Witness (1973) and The Mirror (1974), but lack of commercial success prompted Wright to quit to pursue a solo career.

He released the albums "Extraction" and "Footprint" before the turning point of "Dream Weaver." "The Light of Smiles" (1977) took him into the US Top 30, and gave him a modest hit single with *Phantom Writer*. "The Right Place" (1981) reached 79 on the US album chart, and delivered his final hit single, Really Wanna Know You, which reached 16 in the US.

In 2004, he reunited with Spooky Tooth for two gigs in Germany, preserved on the album "Nomad Poets." In 2008 the band undertook a European tour and appeared at the Island

Records 50th anniversary event at the Shepherd's Bush Empire in west London. In the same year Wright toured north America with Ringo Starr & His All-Starr Band. In 2014 he published Dream Weaver: Music, Meditation and My Friendship with George Harrison.

Gary's music career was punctuated by hits like *Dream* Weaver and Love is Alive in 1976, with the latter peaking at No. 2. His 1979 track, Really Wanna Know You, also made waves, reaching No. 16 on the Billboard Hot 100. "Dream Weaver" achieved Gold record certification in the United States in 1976.


Beyond his solo success, Gary was a sought-after studio musician, notably contributing to ex-Beatle George Harrison's iconic 1970 album "All Things Must Pass" and participating in Harrison's subsequent solo projects throughout the 1970s. Their close bond led Wright to describe Harrison as his "spiritual mentor" in later years. In a 2014 interview, Wright reflected on his spiritual journey, crediting his profound exploration of spiritual life to his association with George Harrison.

"I always had a feeling that God existed and was helping Henderson, and in 1955, appearing with Henderson on The me. It wasn't really defined clearly, but I knew there was something there, and it wasn't until I met George Harrison that I started to really begin to delve deeply into spiritual life."

> Wright's musical contributions extended to collaborations with artists like Ringo Starr and Ronnie Spector during that era. He went on to compose soundtracks for three movies and is recognized as one of the pioneers in introducing the synthesizer to Pop music.

> Gary Wright passed away at the age of 80, succumbing to complications arising from Parkinson's Disease and dementia. His family confirmed his peaceful passing, surrounded by loved ones, at his Palos Verdes Estates residence in California on September 4, 2023.





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
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
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
